Background:

Global Action Nepal (ज्ञान) is dynamic social organization which has been working exclusively in Nepal for more than two decades to help improving the quality of life of marginalized people in Nepal engaging stakeholders meaningfully for quality education, equity, human rights and lifelong learning. GAN works to enhance the rising generation's life chances in Nepal by widening its access to, and participation in, empowering, community sustaining, gender-equalizing, mobilizing youth bulge, vocational and life skills development.

GAN is a non-governmental, non-political, non-profit making independent and impartial national organization. It started working in Nepal since 1999 with the objective of improving the quality and relevance of basic school education, carry out research and advocacy in education and health sector, ensure inclusion, access and equity in all children for basic health and education, develop social and emotional life skills of children and youth, promote volunteerism, exchange of culture through mobilizing international and national volunteers' involvement in the development process, promote protection of and human rights focusing child and women, disaster risk reduction, advocacy and network building.

GAN supported educational materials for Thami children of Dolakha district with support from Michael Parker Foundation, Aussie Action Abroad in collaboration with Gan Learning Center at 19 October 2023.



Kathmandu



15 April 2024, GAN in collaboration with Aussie Action Abroad distributed Education materials for marginalized children during Welcome to school in Kailali and Lapsiphedhi Nanglebhare (The most remote area) of Kathmandu.

2. Attended on Conferences

A) SMCR Conference 2023

Mr. BK Shrestha, Executive Director of GAN attended the SMCR conference held in Bethesda, Washington DC, USA from 21-23 July 2023. During the conference he was presented the situation and practice of menstruation in Nepal and preliminary result of DWD jointly with Sara Parker.



B) BRANNGO Conference

On 23 November 2023, BK Shrestha (Executive Director), Shree Krishna Wenju (Program Director) and Laxmi Dhital (Researcher) of GAN attended on BRANNGO Conference 2023 at British Embassy.



3. Teacher Trainings

A) Child Friendly Teaching Learning and Material Development



Global Action Nepal supported to facilitate three days teacher training on child friendly teaching learning skill and material development for teachers of Mount Everest English Secondary School, Salleri, Solukhumbu district, Koshi Province of Nepal from 21 - 23 July 2023.

B) Hybrid Teacher Training

Global Action Nepal organized 4 days hybrid professional development of Head/Teachers for 21st Century training from 31st December 2023 to 3rd January 2024 in collaboration with Aussie Action Abroad, Lalitpur Metropolitan City ward number 22 and Gan Research and Learning Resource Center. 15 head teachers and teachers were participated in the training. Facilitators for the training was from Australia and Nepal jointly.



C) Better Class Better Learning Hybrid Course Kaski

Six schools in Madi has been actively engaging in transferring their conventional teaching learning to joyful classroom learning after whole schools teachers training. They had a

monitoring visit by the outsider consultant to see the progress and explore what support they need in the coming days. The observation visit was wonderful in the sense that all the school teachers and head teachers' pay much attention to what we share as observers. The project is in the collaboration with Pahar Trust Nepal.

D) Training of Trainers (TOT) Course



Five days Better Class Better Learning workshop were carried out in Pokhara on 19-23 April 2024. Out of these five days 2 days were entirely given to Training of Trainers for Madi and Lamjung participants and they practice/deliver to the participants' school teachers from Pokhara. These trainings were done in collaboration with Pahar Trust Nepal, SunPad project and Aussie Action Abroad.

4. Review and Planning Meeting



Global Action Nepal organized one day review and planning meeting on 5 November 2023 at Gan Research and Learning Resource Center, Chunikhel, Lalitpur. GAN board of directors including members and staffs were sitting together and doing reflection and planning together for the social transformation and discussed on further planning of the organization including 25th celebration process of the organization.

5. First Aid Training

On 2nd December 2023, Global Action Nepal (GAN) organized First Aid Training in collaboration with Gan Research and Learning Resource Center, National First Aid Australia, PAHAR Foundation Nepal (Australia) for the teachers of Lalitpur Ward No. 22.



6. 16 days GBV Campaign

Global Action Nepal organized a series of talk programs on called "GAN SURAKSHYA" on the occasion of 16 days of activism against Gender Based Violence.

7. Attended on First Parenting Education Trainers' Meet

On 5 December 2023, Program Director of GAN, Mr. Shree Krishna Wenju attended on first parenting education trainers' meet at Everest Hotel, Kathmandu organized by UNICEF Nepal.



8. Interaction with Malaysian Teachers



On 18 December 2023, held interaction program with Malaysian teacher team including Malaysian Nature Society, Bird Conservation Nepal, Bird Life International (Asia) about environment education at Gan Learning Center.

9. Collaborative work with Aussie Action Nepal

Global Action Nepal worked collaboratively with the group of architects, educators and photographers came from Aussie Action Abroad from Australia from 31st December 2023 to 2nd January 2024.

10. Resource for Menstruation Education (R4ME)

The menstruation Education materials impact field study has been done, these materials were children learning book, Teachers guide book and other additional materials. The Researcher are in the process of analyzing the data and preparing the final report. As per the visual interview, the materials has not been reached to the subject teachers in many schools but whoever has received materials they are found helpful and effective to teach and learn about menstrual education.

Training on teaching process of menstruation education in the class

Two days training for teachers and facilitators of the Lalitpur Metropolitan City, ward number 22 in coordination with ward office completed on 24 and 25 August 2023. The main objective of the training was capacity building on menstruation education to them and



testing the child-friendly teaching techniques/tools during the training for the revision process of the toolkit/reference books.

Kaski visit : Tangting Visit for Videography of R4ME

Global Action Nepal team jointly with Sara Parkar (LJMU) visited Kaski for videography capturing under R4ME project from 12 - 16 December 2023.



Interaction with Children with Disability

Global Action Nepal organized one day interaction program with children with disability and surveyed the information about the utilization of resource materials published by GAN with children with disability with different grades on May 2024.

Celebration of MH Day 2024

Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) is defined as 'Women and adolescent girls using a clean menstrual management material to absorb or collect blood that can be changed in privacy as often as necessary for the duration of the menstruation period, using soap and water for washing the body as required, and having access to facilities to dispose of used menstrual management material'. And, Menstrual Hygiene Day (MHD, MH Day in short) is marked on May 28 every year in order to highlight the importance of good [menstrual hygiene management](#).

With the theme, Global Action Nepal along with Menstruation Hygiene Management Partners Alliance (MHMPA) and other organizations working in the field of Menstruation jointly organized MH Day with different activities. The major highlights of the program was the exhibition related to MHM and the policy dialogue related to the same. The program was supportive in showcasing the activities being carried out in MHM sector by different organization and to share the best practices within one common platform. As being the member of MHMPA, Global Action Nepal also actively participated in both of the events i.e. stall exhibition and policy dialogue related to MHM.

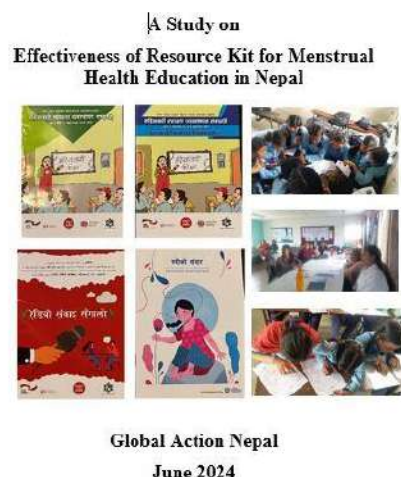


GAN also supported to organized activities during Menstrual Hygiene day (MH Day 2024) celebration program in Nepal with the slogan of "Together for a #PeriodFriendlyWorld". During the MH day, GAN organized orientation on Menstrual Hygiene Management for students, teachers, women's group, local government representative and head teachers at GAN Center, Laliptur. GAN also jointly organized cycle rally on the occasion of MH Day 2024 in

collaboration with the X-pose Nepal and the organizations working for health and menstruation in Nepal.

Prepared Draft Report

Draft report of the research under Resource for Menstruation Education (R4ME) prepared by the consultant and submitted to GAN for further discussion. The title of the report is "A Study on Effectiveness of Resource Kit for Menstrual Health Education in Nepal". During the preparation of the report, research survey relating to R4ME to school, teachers and students as well as interaction with mothers completed in all seven provinces of Nepal. Based on the survey with school, teachers, students and mother, coding process of the surveyed documents completed then data entry of the coding was done. Based on the data of the study the analysis was done for preparation of the report.



Advisor Pannel Meeting

- a) On 9 December 2023, held advisor panel meeting under R4ME project at Gan Research and Learning Resource Center, Chunikhel, Lalitpur. During the meeting the progress of the R4ME report was discussed and suggested on the preparation process of the report for its finalization process by the participated advisors.



- b) On 28 June 2024, held advisor panel meeting under R4ME project at Royal Alinas Bakery Cafe, Jawalkhel, Lalitpur. During the meeting Dr. Kishore Shrestha, consultant, briefly explained about the tools development process, data collection process from school, teachers, students (individually and mini-workshop) and mothers under the study of the research and how have been the report is prepared and stage of the report preparation process. Also shared about the glimpse of findings of the study including the population of study relating to the number of schools, teachers, students and mothers. Dr. Kishore Shrestha committed to adjust the feedback and suggestion provided by the team as much as possible and will share soon after finalizing the draft report to the team.



Interaction Program on Dignity Life of Women



On the occasion of 16 days activism against Gender Based Violence, GAN organized one day interaction program on "Dignity Life of Women" on 10 December 2023 in coordination with Gan Research and Learning Resource Center, Dignity without Danger, Swarnim Anubhav, Girls Kick, Kushal Nepal, Aussie Action Abroad.

Vending Machine Handover Program

Global Action Nepal supported vending machine to Kavre District Police Office. During the program GAN handedover the vending machine to SSP of Kavre District Police Office.



11. Study on Out of School Children (OSC)

On 12 September 2023, Global Action Nepal (GAN) organized one day meeting for update with the MoEST on the status of OOSC study, committee formation, selection of palika for the qualitative study as per TOR and data access. During the meeting Yamunamai RM from Rautahat and Lalbandi M from Sarlahi (Madhesh Province), Sisne RM from Rukum East (Lumbini Province) and Kaikote RM from Dolpa (Karnali Province) were selected for the study. And agreed to work under NFE LLA thematic working committee as the coordination and working committee for this study. 4 representative from MoEST, 2 representatives from CEHRD, 2 from UNICEF, 1 from UNESCO and 3 from GAN were presented in the meeting. From 24 September to 13 October 2023, field visits for KII and FGD carried out in all targeted 4 rural/municipalities (Sisne RM - Rukum East, Yamunamai RM - Rautahat, Lalbandi M - Sarlahi and Kaikote RM - Dolpa) for the study of the OOSC. GAN organized central level sharing of the finding of draft report of study on OOSC at CEHRD meeting hall. During the sharing program representatives from **MoEST**, **CEHRD** and UNICEF were participated in the program.

GAN organized provincial level sharing of the finding of draft report of study on OOSC in Karnali Province (19 January 2024) at Surkhet, Lumbini Province (20 January 2024) at Nepalgunj and Madhesh Province (28 January 2024) at Janakpur jointly with representatives from MoEST and CEHRD.

12. The SunPad Research Project

UK team visit to Nepal

10 persons team with different discipline from Cardiff University arrived in Nepal for the SunPad project Kick-Off meeting on 26th February. The research project has focused on to study current practices of using Menstruation Pads and piloting SunPad produced and experimented in the Wales community. It is a collaboratively planned research project between Cardiff University, Tribhuvan University and Global Action Nepal. During their time in Nepal they have interacted with women group, teachers, children and Health post people around Gan learning Centre in Lalitpur.



Kaski visit: Rivan (Machhapurchre RM with Merigold) for pre-assessment of the location for the SunPad Study

Global Action Nepal team jointly with Krishna Hari Poudel (Merigold) Sara Parkar (LJMU) visited Kaski for meeting with Merigold Chain and site visit for the SunPad Study program from 12 - 16 December 2023.



Teacher Training to Teachers of Kaski

3 days teacher training course were conducted for the teachers from the SunPad project sites rural village Rivan and Pokhara city as an urban area. These course were as an entry of the inception phase of the SunPad project to build the relationship with the local people.



Recruitment of the staffs

GAN completed recruitment process of staffs for the SunPad research project. During the selection process, first phase and second phase interview were taken to the candidates of qualitative researcher (QR) and field researcher (FR). Then selection process was completed after organizing selection screening and capacity building workshop which was held on 6-7 July 2024 at Gan Research and Learning Resource Center, Lalitpur. For QR, Ms. Shital Shakya and for FRs, Ms. Shimran Parajuli and Mrs. Krishna Kumari Sunar is selected.



Ethical Approval for Research

GAN proceed for the ethical approval process to Nepal Health Researcher Council (NHRC) Nepal on 23 May 2024 with support from Cardiff University and got approval of research protocol on 23 July 2024 for the SunPad research.

Health Post Data Collection

GAN collected information of health post from Rivan Health Post, Machhapuchhre Rural Municipality Ward No. and Matrishishu Hospital located in Pokhara Metropolitan City Ward No. 16 which are the targeted area of SunPad research and these information shared with Cardiff University.

Pre-Assessment of the Topic Guide



GAN organized pre-assessment of the topic guide to test and validate the tools of the topic guide for focused group discussion. A total of 5 women from Laligurans Women Group participated in the pre-assessment of Topic Guide on 19th July 2024 at Gan Learning Center. Ms. Shital Shakya, Qualitative Researcher carried out the pre-assessment, with support from Mr. Shree

Krishna Wenju and Mrs. Saraswati Shrestha. Four participants were married, the eldest participant was 41 years old, whereas the youngest participant aged 24 was a student.

13. Science in the Sky Project

Baseline Survey of Science Subject

GAN conducted baseline survey of science subject to 4 schools of Kwolasothar Rural Municipality, Lumjung. During the study, Classes of science teacher were observed based on 7 major indicators, which were preparation, classroom management, use of learning material, teaching learning activities, class work and class participation, evaluation and classroom environment and culture. And status of utilization of science lab in the schools also observed and interacted with teachers about its usage during the survey. *(Attached detail report with this report)*



Teacher Training on Science Subject and Use of Science Laboratory

GAN organized five days teacher training on science subject and use of science laboratory for teachers of Khwolasothar Rural Municipality, Lamajung from 22 - 26 May 2024. Objective of the training was use of science lab for practical and project work according to new curriculum, prepare and collect appropriate materials and use effectively during science teaching, prepare teachers for practical experiments using science lab, make clear concept on child friendly teaching process of science in class room, do formative and summative evaluation according to new curriculum. Nine teachers (two female) from four schools of Kwolasothar RM and one school from Madhy Nepal Municipality of Lamjung were participated in the training.



14. Civil Society Participation in Education (COPE)

Kick of Meeting of the Project

A day Kick of meeting conducted on 21st April 2024 in the presence of EU, UNICEF, Save the Children, People in Need, VSO and NGO federation.

Meeting with consortium partner

On 31st May, 2024 a planning meeting was conducted at NCE Nepal with the consortium partners to finalize the detail implementation plan for common understanding. The meeting finalized DIP, conduction of baseline survey by NCE Nepal, organizing local level events by NDWA followed by GAN at province level.

Detail Implementation Plan (DIP) preparation

Global Action Nepal drafted year 1 detail implementation plan for the annual planning process to conduct events in province level (Karnali and Madesh) for further smoothen the planning process with consortium partners.

Baseline Assessment of Local Civil Society Organizations and Local Government

NCE Nepal conducted baseline assessment of local civil society organization and local government with support from consultant under COPE project which is consortium project. During the baseline assessment, GAN supported for information sharing and held meeting with a consultant for baseline survey at Global Action Nepal in the month of June to provides a clear understanding of the current situation, identifies the gaps, and provides the necessary information to develop appropriate interventions. GAN also provided input in the draft baseline report.

15. Youth Ambassador – Pahilo Khudkilo (First Step) program

Training on Youth Ambassador and Youth Leadership

Pahilo khudkilo program kicked off with the recruitment of 15 youth Ambassador (Champions) and 5 focal teachers in coordination with 22 ward chair of Lalitpur Metropolitan City and Adarsha saula Secondary School. The majority of the Youths were from education background and others



were from different department.

They had five days intensive training by an International Trainer from Australia In collaboration with Aussie Action Abroad covering Leadership skills along with presentation skills from 1 to 5 April 2024.

Training on Child Friendly Teaching Learning and Material Development to Youth Ambassador

GAN organized two days training on child friendly teaching learning and material development to youth ambassadors to mobilize them as volunteer teachers in the targeted 5 schools of Lalitpur Metropolitan City Ward No. 22 from 16 to 17 May 2024 at Gan Research and Learning Resource Center, Chunikhel Lalitpur.



Established Green Clubs

An orientation on the importance of conserving environment, campaign to reduce the negative impact of climate change, process to operate school level child club and methods of selecting executive boards were conducted after gathering students from grade 5-8 except in Shree Mahankal Basic School. Youth Ambassadors have facilitated establish 5 green clubs in 5 schools of Lalitpur Metropolitan city-21 and 22.

Plantation program



On 5 June 2024, GAN celebrated world environment day with action organized by youth ambassadors jointly with students from Liverpool John Moore University, UK. During the day GAN organized orientation on climate change including art competition among students of schools of Lalitpur Metropolitan City Ward No. 22 and planted the trees in the ground of GAN Center, Lalitpur.

Green clubs of 5 different schools have initiated the plantation program in the school periphery. The initiation of green club members has encouraged students of schools to keep clean in the classroom, water taps and toilets. Hence, a routine of cleaning campaign has started in the schools. School administrations have also significantly collaborated with green club's activities to conserve school environment and provided dustbins, brooms and dustpan. Spare classroom has been allocated for green campaign.



Menstrual Day Celebration

Youth Ambassadors have conducted interviews with adolescent girls and married women of their communities to comprehend the understanding level on menstrual hygiene/health. After the interview process, focus group discussion with women's group, students and teachers of project schools was conducted on the occasion of world menstrual hygiene day. A day celebration was initiative of



youth ambassadors to objectify the importance of menstrual hygiene and pain alongside with menstrual stigma in the communities. Menstrual campaigners have shared their experience while visiting in the Far Western Development Region of the country. Participants were opened up with their experiences of menstrual hygiene as well.



Menstrual Pain workshop

Global Action Nepal has conducted a workshop on menstrual pain to the youth ambassadors for understanding the reason of extreme pain bearing by the women and remedies to reduce menstrual pain. The workshop was facilitated by the PHD scholar Ms. Elizabeth. Most of the youth ambassadors were connected with the discussion and shared their experiences regarding menstrual pain.



Day Celebration_ World Environment Day

June 5 marked as World Environment Day- 2024 was internationally celebrated with the motive of “Health Earth, Healthy Mankind” and youth ambassadors of Global Action Nepal have organized inter school competitions in title of save environment as such aware and strengthen



the capacity of students by participating in the competitions i.e. Oratory, drawing, poem, quiz and essay. Students from 5 different schools have come all the way

to participate in the oratory and drawing competition and rest of the competitions were conducted in a mobile approach (one school was a host cum participants in one competition and rest were participating).



Life Skills Training to Youth Ambassadors

The 7 days of Self Awareness, Inter-Personal, Protective, and Social Responsibility (SIPS) Life Skill Training was conducted from 19-25 July 2024. This training was organized by Global Action Nepal (GAN) and Gan Research and Learning Resource Centre (Gan Learning Centre) jointly collaboratively with Lalitpur Metropolitan City-22.

In the training, there were the presence of altogether 15 girls' adolescent Youth Ambassadors. This training with the aim of developing Self Awareness, Protective skills, Interpersonal skill



and Social Responsibility skill among the grade 6-8 students of their respective communities. The whole

training was facilitated by Mr. Pujan Shakya, a Project Officer and technically supported by Mr. Shree Krishna Wenju, a Program Director. After the training, youth ambassadors have enlightened to identify relation mapping, trust building, effective communication, differentiating dream and goals, analyzing good and bad habits, child rights and protection, good and bad touch, online safety, team work.



Rolling out the life skills training in schools

Youth Ambassadors were rolled out in their respective schools to conduct orientation on life skills training to the students. Life skills



training to 5 schools were conducting at the same time incorporating with the syllabus context. In total 98 students (B:40, G:58) were regular and actively



participated in the training. School administration and parents felt necessary of these kinds of training in the schools after seeing some positive changes in the behavior of the students. One of the parents shared her boy has gradually been taking care of his younger sister after orientation.

Mobilizing Green Club



Youth Ambassadors have been facilitating to mobilize green club in their respective schools by formulating monthly action plan. To specify in the climate change and role of child club members and students to conserve school and community environment green clubs have been conducting different programs i.e. Oratory, drawing, poem, quiz and essay connecting with day celebration and in every Friday after lunch break. Conducting these



programs have gradually increases the involvement of students in cleaning campaign and maintaining their personal health.

Child Friendly Teaching as a Volunteer Teacher



Global Action Nepal has conducted a 5 days training on child friendly teaching learning methods to incorporate in school/formal education by youth ambassadors and teachers for deliver quality education. In this training 15 youth ambassadors and 5 focal teachers were participated. After the training, youth ambassadors are rolling out in the schools in their spare time. Teaching

with the use of materials and play have significantly changing behaviors of students and enjoying learning environment.



16. Exploration Workshop in Lamjung

A day exploration workshop has been organized for schools in Bulbhule Lamjung on 12 January 2024 in collaboration with Aussie Action Abroad. The workshop was focused on the issues of migration and reducing the number of children in the area day by day. Representatives from five school communities - Principals, teachers, SMC and parent representatives, past students, Municipal staff, Global Action Nepal and Aussie Action Abroad staff and volunteers were present at the Workshop and established a network of support and commence development of a Cluster Improvement Plan to address shared concerns around student migration, a concerted effort by government schools to work together is now in motion, with a collaborative approach towards the development and implementation of a Cluster Improvement Plan.



The three key goals identified by the Bhulbhule Cluster for this Improvement Plan are:

1. Building School Pride
2. Encouraging Community Engagement
3. Building Teaching Capacity.

17. Sports for Gender equity



A day Sports for gender equity was conducted for 19 school's teachers in Budhanilkantha in collaboration with Budhanilkantha Municipality and Cricket beyond Boundaries UK on 20 March 2024. Participants enjoyed with it and planning to share in school and their colleagues to use this techniques in teaching children with fun.
